EdVenture Partners with Reconnecting McDowell

Reconnecting McDowell recently joined forces with EdVenture to organize a one-day leadership education training across the County and to develop student mentoring activities. EdVenture is a nonprofit educational institution dedicated to creating new generations of lifelong learners through museum experiences, after-school programming and camps. Its mission is to inspire children and the adults who care about them to experience the joy of learning as individuals and together.

Reconnecting McDowell served as the fiscal agent when EdVenture

successfully applied for a grant through the West Virginia State Development Office's Flex-E Grant Program. The \$10,000 that was awarded will be used to support the logistical and material needs for the countywide training for high school and middle school students. The training will provide skills that enable college and career readiness and expose the student participants to teaching as a viable career path, with breakout sessions focusing on attitude and vision; team building and time management; coaching and commitment; and comfort zone and college readiness. The leadership

training will also entail a student-tostudent mentorship component that will allow high school students to mentor K-8 students. Reconnecting McDowell will work with the school district to assist with student outreach and coordination of the mentorship activities.

Broader Horizons Spotlight on Joseph Hayes

Joseph Hayes, a senior at Mount View High School has been selected to play in the High School All American Bowl Presented by Bret Cooper Football in February, with the date and location to be determined. Coaches nominate football players for the honor; the student athletes must have at least a 3.0 grade point average and demonstrate good character. Joseph will play with and against other top high school athletes in the country, and college scouts will be on hand to watch the game and check out the talent.

Joseph plans to enroll in college next year and major in either physical therapy or construction, both of which have been passions of his from an early age. Reflecting on the past year, Joseph talks about the impact that Reconnecting McDowell's Broader Horizons mentorship program has

had on his life: "I've learned many things about public speaking and a lot about politics. I've also gained very influential mentors and met people who will drop anything to help me in all the things I plan to do." Joseph plays basketball and baseball in addition to football, noting that he also loves deep-sea diving, parasailing, jet skiing and anything that has to do with the beach and the ocean.

Federal Grant Will Be Used to Improve Sewer Line

Former West Virginia Gov. Earl Ray Tomblin announced in December that the state has received a \$12 million federal grant that will be used to improve water and sewer lines. McDowell County will receive \$1.3 million from the grant, which will help to replace the current sewer system that led to pollution of the Clear Fork River. This is a welcomed direct investment in infrastructure that moves the needle forward not only on health and well-being but also on future economic development in the County.
